SURVIVOR EMPOWERMENT


- 178 American survivors served through Rescue/ Escape Operations & Emergency Services

- 174 new American Safe Housing opportunities funded.

THE PROBLEM

When Safe House Project began in 2017, here is the problem we were facing:

300,000

In 2017 the Department of Justice reported that there were hundreds of thousands of American children trafficked for sex in the United States each year

1%

Victim identification of the 300k children trafficked was at 1%. That means only 1% were ever seeing rescue or exit from trafficking.

80%

Without restorative care upon their rescue or exit from trafficking, 80% of trafficked individuals ended up back in traffickers' hands.

100

Those escaping trafficking needed a safe place to heal but in 2017, there were only 100 beds in restorative care homes for minors in America.

OUR MISSION

Safe House Project exists to combat domestic sex trafficking by increasing victim identification of trafficked individuals above 1% through education, build the national capacity of restorative care opportunities through funding and mentorship, and empower a survivor's path to freedom through economic empowerment.


